

## FOOTBALL RULES STUDY QUESTIONS

LHSAA Study Guide Questions: The final test will come from these questions. LHSAA test questions come from the NFHS Rules Book, including rule changes, Points of Emphasis and Fundamentals, as well as the Louisiana Mechanics Manual and NFHS Case Book.

NOTE: In the following questions, " $A$ " refers to the team which puts the ball in play (Offense), and " $B$ " refers to their opponents (Defense). " $K$ " refers to the kicking team and " $R$ " refers to the receiving team. "A1", "A2"...etc., "B1"..."K1"...and "R1" are players of these teams. A team's end zone is the one it is defending. If team possession changes during a down, each team retains its identity. In a kicking situation, it is not during a try and no fair catch signal has been given unless so specified. Unless otherwise stated, acts occur while the ball is inbounds; a forward pass is legal; any out-of-bounds is between the goal lines; "line" means scrimmage line; reference to a foul is to a player foul which is not unsportsmanlike; there is no foul or change of possession unless so stated; penalties are considered accepted. Important: Answers to these questions should be selected based solely on the information stated therein.

1. During the play, the Umpire notices that a player does not have the usual protrusions indicating that hip pads and tailbone protector are being worn. It is found that the player is wearing a manufactured girdle with closed cell "bubble type" protective padding that conforms and covers the hips and tailbone. RULING: There is no padding criteria listed for hip pads and tailbone protector. Therefore, the pads are legal. [1-5-1d1; Case Book 1.5.1 E(b)]
2. After the ball is ready for play, each player of $\boldsymbol{A}$ who participated in the previous down and each substitute for $\boldsymbol{A}$ must have been, momentarily, between the 9 -yard marks, before the snap. [7-2-1; Case Book 7.2.1 C]
3. Following the snap on a kick try or field-goal attempt, the offensive linemen "step down" and interlock their feet while blocking. RULING: Foul for illegal blocking . . . 10-yard penalty. [7-2-2, Penalty; Case Book 7.2.2]
4. During the months of August and September, there shall be a mandatory heat time-out at the halfway point of every quarter. These time-outs shall be official time-outs and will allow the players to rest briefly and hydrate their bodies.
[3-5-7g; LHSAA Handbook: Football 14.3.10]
5. When weather conditions are construed to be hazardous to life or limb of the participants, the crew of game officials is authorized to make the decision on whether to delay or suspend the game. [3-1-5; Case Book 3.1.5 A, B]
6. For a scrimmage down, $\mathbf{7}$ Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ players must be legally on their line at the snap in order to have a legal formation. [2-14-1; 7-2-5a]
7. An illegal forward pass is considered to have occurred during a loose-ball play. [2-33-1b, 2; 10-3-1, 2]
8. When the $\mathbf{4 0}$-second play clock is running, the ball becomes ready for play, and Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ may snap it, when an official places the ball at the appropriate spot between the hash marks and steps toward his position. [3-6-1b2; Case Book 3.6.1 Comment 1]
9. Possession of a live ball in the opponent's end zone is always a touchdown. [8-2-1; FUNDAMENTALI-8]
10. B36 intercepts a pass at his own 3 -yard line. His momentum takes him into his own end zone, where he fumbles. B52 and A88 simultaneously recover the loose ball, which never leaves the end zone. RULING: [7-4-3c; 8-5-2a Except.]
a. Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ scores a safety.
b. Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ scores a touchdown.
c. Touchback; Team $\boldsymbol{B}$ will get the ball at its own 20 -yard line.
d. The momentum exception applies; Team $\boldsymbol{B}$ will get the ball at its own 3 -yard line.
11. A defensive player is considered to be on his line of scrimmage when he is within $\mathbf{1}$ yard of his scrimmage line at the snap. [2-25-3]
12. Anytime the play clock is interrupted for improperly worn or missing equipment by a player, the player is to be removed from the contest for at least one play. [1-5-1b1; 1-5-5, 6; 3-5-2b; 3-5-10e; Case Book 3.5.10 I Comment]
13. $4^{\text {th }}$ and 6 to go for Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ from its own 40 -yard line. They initially set in a scrimmagekick formation with $\boldsymbol{A 8 3}$ as an interior lineman and 4 other linemen numbered 50-79. Prior to the snap, B75 encroaches. Following enforcement, Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ lines up with $\boldsymbol{A} 83$ on the end of the line and through substitution has 5 interior linemen numbered 50-79. A83 then goes downfield and catches a touchdown pass. RULING: Legal play . . . the touchdown stands. [7-2-5b Except. 2; Case Book 7.2.5 F]
14. A scrimmage kick recovered in or behind the neutral zone may not be advanced by either team. [6-2-2, 3; Fundamental $\mathrm{VI}-2$ ]
15. Ready for play signifies that the ball may be put in play by a snap or a free kick with 25 seconds or 40 seconds on the play clock. [2-35]
16. 25 seconds will be put on the play clock and start on the ready-for-play signal: [3-6-1a1(a, b, d)]
a. Prior to a try following a score.
b. To start a period or overtime series.
c. Following a charged time-out.
d. Any of the above.
17. If a loose ball goes into the end zone, the last player who touches the ball in the field of play is the one deemed responsible for forcing it across the goal line. [2-13-2]
18. Tripping any opponent is illegal anywhere on the field.
[2-45; 9-4-3o; Case Book 2.42.1 (d)]
19. A cloud-to-ground lightning bolt is seen. RULING: The officiating crew should suspend play and undertake the recommended safety precautions.
[Rules Book Pg. 102: NFHS GUIDELINES (Lightning - 3)]
20. In order for a scrimmage formation to be legal at the snap, at least 5 Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ players must be on their line of scrimmage and no more than 4 Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ players may be backs. [2-14-1; 7-2-5a; Case Book 7.2.5 C]
21. $3^{\text {rd }}$ down and 5 at Team A's 30-yard line. Quarterback A10's handoff to $\boldsymbol{A} \mathbf{3 2}$ is fumbled and the ball is in flight when $\boldsymbol{A} 22$ bats it forward and out of bounds at $\boldsymbol{A}$ 's 35 -yard line. RULING: [5-1-2a; 5-1-3a; 9-7-2]
a. Foul for illegal batting. 15-yard penalty from the previous spot \& replay the down.
b. Foul for illegal touching. 10-yard penalty from the spot of the foul \& loss of down.
c. No foul. Legal play. Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ gets a first down at their $35-y a r d$ line.
22. It shall be an "administrative stoppage" of play when time-out for an injury is granted. The play clock shall be set to 25 seconds and started on the ready-for-play signal. [3-6-1a1(e); LHSAA Attachment A - 2c FAQs]
23. On a kickoff, at the time the ball is kicked, at least $4 \boldsymbol{K}$ players must be on each side of the kicker. [6-1-4; Case Book 6.1.4]
24. During a try, it is possible for either team to score points. [8-3-3]
25. If a foul occurs during a down, the basic enforcement spot is determined by the action that occurs during the down. [10-4-1]
26. $\quad 4^{\text {th }}$ and 5 yards to go at Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ 's 20 -yard line. Holder $\boldsymbol{K} \mathbf{1 5}$ muffs the snap and the ball is loose on the ground at Team R's 27-yard line. K44 kicks the rolling ball, which goes through the uprights. RULING: [2-24-4; 8-4-1b; 9-7-1, Pen.; 10-6; Case Book 9.7.1 A]
a. Foul. 10-yard penalty from the spot of the kick.
b. Foul. 10-yard penalty from the previous spot.
c. Foul. 15-yard penalty from the spot of the kick.
d. Legal play. Count the field goal.
27. A player who is attempting to pass is a runner until he/she gives up possession of the ball by passing. [2-32-11, 13]
28. $\quad 2^{\text {nd }}$ down and 10 for Team $\boldsymbol{A}$. During the down, $\boldsymbol{A} 76$ held and $\boldsymbol{B} 24$ committed pass interference after which B38 intercepted and was immediately downed. RULING: This is a double foul. No options . . Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ will replay $2^{\text {nd }}$ down and 10 from the previous spot. [10-2-1b; 10-2-2; 10-4-2b; Case Book 10.2.1 A]
29. Post-scrimmage kick (PSK) fouls and penalty enforcements do not apply to kick tries, successful field goals or in overtime. [2-16-2h1; Rules Book Pg. 87: OT 10-4-3]
30. $\boldsymbol{A} 23$ is carrying the ball when $\boldsymbol{B 4 0}$ grabs his jersey from behind just below the collar in the name plate area. $\mathbf{A} 23$ crosses the goal line and is then pulled down backward by B40. RULING: Horse-collar foul on B40. Count the touchdown. A has the option to penalize Team $\boldsymbol{B}$ on either the try or subsequent kickoff.
[8-2-1a; 8-2-2; 9-4-3k; Case Book 9.4.3 P(b)]
31. During a down midway through the $4^{\mathrm{TH}}$ period, runner $\boldsymbol{A} 28$ is legally tackled and loses his helmet as a result of the contact. Hoping to keep his player in the game at a crucial point, Team A's coach immediately requests and is granted a charged time-out. RULING: A28 must be replaced for one down as a charged team time-out does not exempt a player from having to leave the game. [3-5-10d; Case Book 3.5.10 E]
32. Team K's deep kickoff bounces at $R$ 's 10-yard line and is in the air above the end zone when R30, standing on his 1-yard line, reaches in and grabs it and begins a return. RULING: Since the kick did not touch the ground or any player in the end zone, R30's return is allowed to continue. [4-2-2d1; 6-3-1a; Case Book 4.2.2 D]
33. $4^{\text {th }}$ down and 10 on Team K's 30-yard line. K16's short punt is muffed by $\boldsymbol{R 4 8}$ at Team K's 40-yard line. The loose ball rolls behind the neutral zone and is recovered by K32 at Team K's 25-yard line. From there, K32 throws a forward pass intended for eligible K21 which falls incomplete. RULING: [5-1-3f; 7-5-1, 2; 7-5-5; Case Book 5.1.3 D]
a. K32's pass is illegal.
b. It will be Team K's ball at Team K's 30-yard line.
c. It will be Team R's ball at Team K's 30-yard line.
d. The ball is dead when $\boldsymbol{K} 32$ recovers.
34. It is legal for players to use completely clear or completely white tooth and mouth protectors as long as they protect and separate both biting surfaces.
[1-5-1d5(a); Case Book 1.5.1 C(a)]
35. Illegal forward handing, illegal forward pass and illegal touching of a forward pass by an ineligible are the only fouls which carry a "loss-of-down" penalty. [10-1-6]
36. For scrimmage downs, Team $\boldsymbol{B}$ is required to have at least 5 players on their line of scrimmage. [7-2-5d]
37. The down is ended and the ball becomes dead when any forward pass is incomplete or simultaneously caught by opposing players. [4-2-2c]
38. A field goal is scored even if part of the ball passes through the line of the upright extended. [8-4-1c; Case Book 8.4.1 A(a)]
39. The loss-of-down aspect of a penalty does not come into play following a change of possession or if the line to gain is reached after enforcement. [Fundamental $X-8$ ]
40. A blindside block against an opponent other than the runner is legal if it is initiated within the free-blocking zone. [9-4-3n; Case Book 9.4.3 W, X]
41. K15's free kick is at rest at Team R's 1-yard line when R20 muffs the ball trying to recover it. The ball then hits the goal-line pylon. RULING: Touchback. Team A's ball at its own 20-yard line. [1-2-4; 2-24-2; 8-5-3a1; 8-5-4]
42. In attempting to tackle A1, B2's helmet comes completely off. A1 does not go down and runs for a touchdown. RULING: The score stands and B2 must leave the field for 1 play. [3-5-10d; 4-2-2k; Case Book 4.2.2 K]
43. As the Line Judge is retrieving the ball from tackled runner A24, he notices $\boldsymbol{A} 24$ is wearing corrective eyeglasses with tinted lenses. RULING: Legal [1-5-3c-4 NOTE]
44. K25's short kickoff is in flight 14 yards beyond Team K's free-kick line when $\boldsymbol{K} \mathbf{3 0}$ catches it with no $\boldsymbol{R}$ players around. RULING: [6-5-6a]
a. Legal play; it's K's ball at the spot of the catch.
b. Legal play only if no Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ player is in position to catch the ball.
c. Legal play regardless if a Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ player is in position to catch the ball.
d. Kick-catch interference on K30 under any circumstance.
45. If the kickers catch or recover a free kick anywhere after it has been touched by $\boldsymbol{R}$, the ball remains live. [2-24-2; 4-2-2f; 6-1-6; Case Book 6.1.6 A]
46. An offensive player may push, pull or lift the runner to assist his forward progress only if that action occurs behind the line of scrimmage. [9-1; Case Book 9.1]
47. $3^{\text {rd }}$ and 10 from team $\boldsymbol{A}$ 's 20 -yard line. As time expires in the $2^{\mathrm{ND}}$ quarter, QB $\boldsymbol{A} 8$ scrambles to Team A's 23-yard line and throws a forward pass intended for eligible A44. $B 27$ blocks $\boldsymbol{A} 44$ before the pass arrives and it falls incomplete. RULING: The only foul in this situation is an illegal forward pass beyond the line of scrimmage. The loss-of-down aspect dictates no replay of the down. The half is ended.
[3-3-4b3; 7-5-2b, Penalty; 7-5-7]
48. If a place kick is used for a try, it is a scrimmage-kick formation and the numbering exception may be used. [7-2-5b Except. 2; Case Book 7.2.5 F]
49. While K9's punt is in flight, K42 commits a holding foul. R33 returns the ball for a touchdown. RULING: The touchdown counts but since K's foul occurred prior to the change of possession, $R$ 's only option for a distance penalty is on the try. [8-2-3; Case Book 6.2 R(a)]
50. A pass from $\boldsymbol{A} 10$ is possessed by $\boldsymbol{A} 25$ while he is in the air above $\boldsymbol{B}$ 's end zone. $\boldsymbol{A} 25$ loses control when he is hit by B36 while in the air. The loose ball is subsequently caught by eligible A41 in B's end zone. RULING: Touchdown.
[2-4-1; 8-2-1b; Case Book 7.5.4 B(b)]
51. Pass eligibility rules apply to all forward passes. [7-5-6]
52. $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ and 10 for Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ at their own 20 -yard line. Team $\boldsymbol{B}$ intercepts $\boldsymbol{A} 10$ 's pass at $\boldsymbol{A}$ 's 40 -yard line and advances to A's 20-yard line. During the return, B52 clips A60 at A's 30 -yard line and $\boldsymbol{A} 26$ commits a 5 -yard face mask foul at $\boldsymbol{A}$ 's 35 -yard line. $\boldsymbol{B}$ subsequently fumbles and $\boldsymbol{A}$ recovers the ball at $\boldsymbol{A}$ 's 35 -yard line. RULING: Double foul. Replay the down. [9-3-6; 9-4-3h; 10-2-1b; Case Book 10.2.1b]
53. A request for a time-out may be made only after the ball becomes dead by any player, the head coach or his designee. [3-5-2a; Case Book 3.5.2 B]
54. It is legal for $\boldsymbol{A} \mathbf{1}$ to immediately return to the field and make a block or touch a pass after being blocked or pushed out of bounds by $\boldsymbol{B 2}$. [9-6-1]
55. A46 is beyond the neutral zone in position to catch a deep pass. B23 turns his back to the ball and directs his attention to $\mathbf{A 4 6}$ by waving his hands and arms to block the vision of the potential receiver but does not make any contact. RULING: Legal action by B23. No foul on the play. [7-5-10; Case Book 7.5.10 C]
56. A33's fumble rolls forward and out of bounds at Team A's 25 -yard line. The game clock will start: [3-4-3a; 3-4-4e]
a. On the Referee's signal only if more than 2 minutes remain in either half.
b. On the Referee's signal regardless of the time remaining.
c. On the snap.
d. Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ has the option to start it either on the snap or the ready-for-play signal.
57. $2^{\text {nd }}$ and 9 at Team $\boldsymbol{A}^{\prime}$ 's 30 -yard line. A21 fumbles and the ball bounces high in the air. B42 leaps at the 38 -yard line, controls the ball while airborne and lands touching the sideline at Team A's 40-yard line. RULING: [2-36-1; 4-2-2b; 4-3-1; 5-1-3a]
a. $1^{\text {st }}$ and 10 for Team $\boldsymbol{B}$ at Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ 's 40 -yard line.
b. $3^{\text {rd }}$ and 1 for Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ at it's 38 -yard line.
c. $1^{\text {st }}$ and 10 for Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ at it's 40 -yard line.
58. A blindside block is a block against any opponent who does not see the blocker approaching and is legal if executed in the free-blocking zone or with open hands. [2-3-10; 9-4-3n; Case Book 9.4.3 W]
59. 2 teammates who may legally block below the waist in the free-blocking zone against a particular opponent do so by charging at that opponent for a simultaneous block at or below the opponent's knees. RULING: Illegal chop block.
[2-3-8; 9-3-6 \& Table (Combination Blocks); Case Bk. 9.3.2 B(d)]
60. Unsportsmanlike-conduct fouls by players do not involve contact and accumulate toward disqualification. [2-32-1; 9-5-1, 2; Case Book 9.5]
61. Defensive back B40, running alongside runner $\boldsymbol{A} 24$, reaches and grabs the collar of A24's jersey and pulls him down forward in making the tackle. RULING: Legal defensive play. [9-4-3k; Case Book 9.4.3 M(d)]
62. An inadvertent whistle ends the down. [4-2-3]
63. The penalty for illegally kicking or batting the ball is has been reduced to $\mathbf{5}$ yards. [9-7-1, 2; Penalty]
64. The passer continues to be a defenseless player until the legal forward pass ends or he/she moves to participate in the play. [2-32-11; 2-32-16a]
65. The ball becomes dead and the down ends when a prosthetic limb comes completely off the runner. [4-2-2l]
66. On $4^{\text {th }}$ down, $\boldsymbol{K}$ 's punt is muffed beyond the neutral zone by $\boldsymbol{R} \mathbf{2 5}$ following his fair-catch signal. While the ball is loose following the muff, the covering official sounds his whistle inadvertently. RULING: Replay the down. The Referee will start both the game clock and the $\mathbf{2 5}$-second play clock on the "ready-for-play signal."
[3-4-2c; 3-4-4i; 3-6-1a1c; 4-2-3a; Case Book 4.2.3 A]
67. Before $\boldsymbol{A 1 1}$ throws a pass that goes beyond the neutral zone, guard $\mathbf{A 6 6}$ blocks defensive lineman B75 and drives him back 4 yards. RULING: Offensive pass interference by $\boldsymbol{A} 66$ because he has driven $\boldsymbol{B 7 5}$ beyond the expanded neutral zone. [2-28-2; 7-5-8a; 7-5-12; Case Book 7.5.12 B]
68. During a kick, an offensive player may use his hands or arms to ward off an opponent who is attempting to block him. [2-3-4b]
69. Pass interference restrictions on a legal forward pass begin for: [7-5-8a]
a. $\boldsymbol{A}$ with the snap.
b. $\boldsymbol{B}$ with the snap.
c. A when the ball leaves the passer's hand.
d. None of the above.
70. When R24 gains possession of a kick, blocking below the waist by teammates becomes legal. [2-17-2; 9-3-2]
71. $4^{\text {th }}$ down and 15 on Team K's 30 -yard line. R28 enters the game as the $\mathbf{1 2}^{\text {th }}$ player while K's punt is in flight and blocks during the return. R15 catches the punt at R's 35-yard line and returns to his 42-yard line before being tackled. RULING: IIlegal participation foul on R28. The penalty is enforced from the post-scrimmage kick spot (R 35-yard line). Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ will put the ball in play $1^{\text {st }}$ down 10 after enforcement. [2-30; 5-2-2a1; 9-6-4a; 10-4-3; Case Book 9.6.1 D]
72. At the snap, all $\boldsymbol{A}$ players numbered $\mathbf{5 0 - 7 9}$ are ineligible. [7-5-6a]
73. If runner A21, who is beyond the neutral zone, tosses the ball forward, he has thrown an illegal forward pass. [7-5-1; 7-5-2b]
74. If there is a double foul during the last timed down of a period, the period is automatically extended. [2-16-2b; 3-3-3b; 10-2-1]
75. Following any $4^{\text {th }}$ down play, the clock shall be stopped. $[3-5-9]$
76. Team $K$ is in punt formation on $4^{\text {th }}$ down at Team $R^{\prime}$ 's 40-yard line, using the numbering exception (not having 5 players on the line numbered 50-79). K players assume their initial positions with $\boldsymbol{K} 25$ to the left at tight end and $\boldsymbol{K} 23$ at left tackle. After the snapper touches the ball, $\boldsymbol{K} 25$ shifts back off the line uncovering $\boldsymbol{K} 23$. At the snap, $\boldsymbol{K} 23$ pauses, then goes downfield and catches a touchdown pass. RULING: Foul for illegal touching. Cancel the score. Penalize Team K 5 yards and loss of down from the previous spot.
Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ will play $1^{\text {st }}$ down and 10 from their 45-yard line.
[7-2-5b Exception 2; 7-5-13 Penalty; 10-4-2b; 10-5-3; Case Book 7.2.5 E]
77. The succeeding spot is where the ball was last snapped or free kicked. [2-41-10]
78. If $\boldsymbol{K} \mathbf{2 2}$ 's field-goal attempt deflects off $\boldsymbol{K} \mathbf{5 0}$ 's shoulder while he is in the expanded neutral zone, the attempt will be ruled unsuccessful even if the ball subsequently passes between the uprights above the crossbar. [8-4-1b]
79. No foul causes a live ball to become dead. [2-16-4; Fundamental III - 2]
80. Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ scores a touchdown on the first possession of an extra period. During the try, Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ is flagged for roughing the kicker. The kick is successful. RULING: [8-3-5]
a. The penalty is declined by rule.
b. Team $\boldsymbol{K}$ may accept the point and have the penalty enforced at the start of $\boldsymbol{R}$ 's overtime session.
c. Team $K$ may choose to have the penalty enforced from the previous spot and replay the down.
d. Either b. or c.
81. On the kickoff, the ball bounces high near the sideline. R23 leaps from inbounds and grabs the ball while he is airborne over the field of play. R23 alights so that he lands on the sideline at Team R's 15-yard line. RULING: [2-4-1; Case Book 6.1.9 A]
a. Foul for free kick out of bounds.
b. Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ will put the ball in play at its own 15-yard line.
82. A punt may be used for the free kick on a kickoff. [2-24-5, 8]
83. A backward pass is a pass thrown with its initial direction parallel with or toward the runner's end line. [2-31-5]
84. Team $\boldsymbol{A}$ goes into formation with all players motionless for 3 seconds. When the QB says "Set," all players go into a 3-point stance except guard A62. Back A38 then starts in motion after which $\boldsymbol{A} 62$ goes into his 3-point stance. The ball is snapped 2 seconds later. RULING: [7-2-6, Penalty]
a. No foul. Play on.
b. Illegal motion, a live-ball foul.
c. Illegal shift, a live-ball foul.
d. False start, a dead-ball foul.
85. First touching of a kick by $\boldsymbol{K}$ is ignored if the penalty is accepted for any foul committed during the down. [5-1-6]
86. $4^{\text {th }}$ and 10 on Team K's 20-yard line. Punter $\boldsymbol{K} 19$ takes the snap and starts to run. He pulls up at his 25-yard line and kicks the ball. R28 catches the kick at his 45-yard line and is tackled immediately. RULING:
[2-24-9; 2-33-1d; 6-2-1, Penalty; 9-7-1; 10-4-2 Exception; Case Book 9.7.1 B(a)]
a. The ball is dead immediately.
b. The penalty is 10 yards from the spot of the foul. Team $K$ will play $4^{\text {th }}$ and 15 from its 15 -yard line.
c. The penalty is 10 yards from the succeeding spot. Team $\boldsymbol{R}$ will play $1^{\text {st }}$ and 10 from Team K's 45-yard line.
d. Either b. or c.
87. Even though a non-scoring kick has been touched by $\boldsymbol{R}$ in the field of play it becomes dead immediately when it breaks the plane of $R$ 's goal line.
[2-24-2; 4-2-2d1; Case Book 6.3.1 A]
